From the South (Charlotte, Atlanta)

Follow I-85 North, towards Greensboro
Exit at #119 and turn LEFT onto Groometown Road
Turn LEFT at the second stoplight, onto Grandover Pkwy

From the South (Asheboro, Pinehurst, Southern Pines)

Follow I-220 North towards Greensboro Exit on #78B to Groometown Road Follow loop all the way to Groometown Road, turn right Turn left at the next traffic light onto Grandover Pkwy Please note that HWY 73 is also 220.

From the East (Durham, Raleigh)

Follow I-40 West, into Greensboro Stay left onto I-85 South, towards Charlotte Exit on #122A and turn right onto Groometown Road Turn left at the first stoplight, onto Grandover Pkwy

You will see two (2) 85 signs, One 85 South and One 85 North
Take first exit which is 85 South exit; road will then split
Bear right to take Groometown Road exit
Turn right onto Groometown Road
Turn left at the first stoplight, onto Grandover Pkwy

421 to exit 197 (Winston-Salem/Charlotte Exit) 85 south to 122A to Groometown Road, Grandover exit Turn right at the light Turn left at the next traffic light onto Grandover Pkwy


